

Shaw University and Fayetteville Technical Community College Articulation Agreement

This articulation agreement is designed to facilitate students transferring from Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC) to Shaw University (SU). This agreement particularly applies to students who, after completing an Associate in Applied Science degree in the Speech-language Pathology Assistant Program wish to transfer to Shaw University to pursue a Bachelor of Science Degree in Communication Sciences & Disorders. Students transferring from Fayetteville Technical Community College to Shaw University must meet all admission requirements of Shaw University and will be individually evaluated upon application to the institution.

All credits earned at FTCC in completing the Associate in Applied Science degree in the Speech-language Pathology Assistant Program will be accepted by SU in accordance with the University's transfer policies. This agreement includes core-to-core agreement, in which Shaw University accepts the general education courses embedded in the Fayetteville Technical Community College Associate in Applied Science degree in the Speech-language Pathology Assistant Program. This agreement also includes program-to-program transfer agreement of related courses of study.

However, courses that duplicate a student's course work from another institution, which had previously been evaluated by Fayetteville Technical Community College will not automatically be awarded credit by Shaw University. Students seeking to transfer credit for an equivalent course should have received a grade of "C" or better for transfer by Shaw University. In addition, non-equivalent courses from Fayetteville Technical Community College in which the students received a "C" will transfer as elective courses. Once admitted, students are subject to all Shaw University policies and procedures as outlined by the University Catalog. Completion of the Bachelor's degree from Shaw University (SU) will require FTCC graduates to take some SU General Education and Communication Sciences and Disorders classes in accordance with the Shaw University graduation requirements. Students who have questions may consult a counselor or advisor at either institution for assistance.

Shaw University and Fayetteville Technical Community College agree to review this articulation agreement and relevant transfer equivalencies annually. Fayetteville Technical Community College will designate an individual to serve as liaison for the purpose of monitoring this agreement. Each institution will provide updated catalogs to the other immediately upon their availability.

This agreement may be amended, as needed, for specific program without affecting accuracy of the agreement. This agreement will remain in effect until terminated upon written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate. Such notice will be effective only if given 180 days prior to the intended date of termination. In the event that this agreement is terminated, the terms of the agreement contained herein will remain in effect for a maximum of 2 years.
