

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Fayetteville State University and Fayetteville Technical Community College

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement is to acknowledge that students of Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC) may transfer to the Bachelor of Science in Professional Studies Program at Fayetteville State University (FSU) following completion of an associate's degree at Fayetteville Technical Community College.

II. ELEMENTS

1. To be eligible for application to enroll the student must submit proof of having been awarded an associate's degree from Fayetteville Technical Community College in the form of an official transcript from Fayetteville Technical Community College.
2. Students who complete the associate's degree will be admitted to Fayetteville State University's B.S. in Professional Studies Program, provided they submit all application materials and meet the requirements for admission to the university.

For students who complete an associate's degree at FTCC, FSU will apply a minimum of 60 semester credits in which the grade of C or better has been earned to the Professional Studies program. Credits in which a grade of C or better was earned in excess of 60 semester hours will be evaluated on an individual basis for transfer into specific requirements of the baccalaureate program. At least twenty-five percent of the total credits for the bachelor's degree must be earned at Fayetteville State University.

3. On an as needed basis, FSU and FTCC will share information to ensure that all coursework and learning outcomes accepted for transfer to FSU are at the collegiate level, are comparable to FSU's coursework, and ensure ongoing compliance with the Principles of Accreditation from SACS.

III. TERMS

1. This Agreement is effective as of the date of the fully executed document, and shall continue until terminated. Both parties must approve amendments to the Agreement in writing.
2. Once a year, FSU will provide a report to FTCC that will include the following information about FTCC alumni enrolled at FSU: student's name, enrollment status (undergraduate or graduate, full-time or part-time), major field of study, and dates of attendance.



3. Either party may terminate the Agreement without cause upon 90 days written notice to the other party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may terminate the Agreement immediately in the event that participation under the Agreement may give rise to a violation of any requirement of federal or state law or regulation or the requirements of any accrediting agency having jurisdiction.
4. Admission criteria, academic requirements, and other admission requirements will be subject to the applicable Catalog at the time of the students' admission to FSU. If this articulation agreement is terminated for any reason, graduates of FTCC enrolled in the Professional Studies Program at the time of termination will be permitted to complete their program.
5. The parties grant to each other a non-exclusive, non-transferable license to use each other's trademarks and servicemarks in furtherance of the articulation coordination detailed herein or in a manner solely for the purpose of identifying and communicating the existence of the relationship to Fayetteville Technical Community College students and alumni. Use of trademarks, servicemarks and logos will comply with use policies of the originating institution. The parties shall discontinue the use of the licensed marks and return any and all file and materials containing the licensed marks supplied by the owner at termination or expiration of the Agreement. Neither party grants to the other any interest in the other party's trademarks. Should either originating institution request, in writing, that a particular use of the originating institution's trademarks and/or servicemarks be discontinued, the non-originating institution shall cease and desist such use of the trademarks and/or servicemarks.
6. The parties hereto will have the relationship of independent contractors for all purposes. Each will have complete control over its own performance and the details for accomplishing its own obligations under this Agreement. In no event will the agents, representatives or employees of one party be deemed to be agents, representatives or employees of the other.
7. This Agreement may be executed by a duly authorized representative of each party, either by electronic or facsimile transmission, each of which will be considered an original.
