Articulation Agreement

Agreement between Fayetteville Technical Community College and Western Carolina University for transfer of credit between the Associate Degree in Emergency Medical Science and the Bachelor of Science in Emergency Medical Care

This articulation agreement between Fayetteville Technical Community College and Western Carolina University allow graduates of the FTCC Emergency Medical Science program to transfer credit towards a Bachelor of Science in Emergency Medical Care degree. All WCU liberal studies requirements and criminal justice degree requirements must be completed before a degree will be awarded. Students may complete liberal studies requirements by completing the General Education Core (44-hour core) or, Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Fine Arts degree requirements at FTCC prior to transferring to WCU. A minimum of 32 semester hours of upper level course credit, including 12 semester hours in the major field, need to be completed at Western to earn the Emergency Medical Care Degree.

Articulation Agreement between Fayetteville Technical Community College and Western Carolina University for transfer of credit from the A.A.S. Emergency Medical Science degree at FTCC into the Bachelors of Science in Emergency Medical Care degree at WCU.

- A. FTCC students will be admitted as candidates for the articulation program in Emergency Medical Care upon the completion of the A.A.S. Emergency Medical Science degree.
- B. Students applying under this articulation agreement must meet the same admission standards as all other WCU students for entrance into the Emergency Medical Care program.
- C. FTCC students can earn additional semester hours of transfer credit by completing general education and program requirement courses. Students who complete the 44-hour general education core of courses approved in the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement in 1997, or, Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Fine Arts degree requirements, will have WCU liberal studies requirements waived. Courses used to complete the 44-hour block must be North Carolina community college system semester courses. All courses must be completed with a "C" or higher grade.
- D. To graduate from Western with an Emergency Medical Care degree all students must complete a minimum of 32 semester hours of upper level Western course credit, including a minimum of 12 hours in the major field as described in the attached course equivalency outline.
- E. This agreement will run continually without need for renewal. Copies of this agreement will be distributed to the deans and department heads by February 1 of each year. Any updates to this agreement should be submitted by March 15. If curriculum changes occur in any of the courses identified in this agreement, parties from both institutions will review the changes and update the course equivalency outline.
- F. Either party upon written notice can terminate this agreement. If the agreement is terminated, FTCC students who have matriculated at WCU can continue until completion of the baccalaureate degree if they are continuously enrolled at Western. Also, students who are enrolled at FTCC at the time may continue under the terms of the agreement as long as they are continuously enrolled. If the student ceases enrollment for two regular academic semesters, he/she must re-enroll under the most recently adopted agreement.
