



## Memorandum of Agreement

Between

Fayetteville Technical Community College and Methodist University

In recognition of the quality Associate degree graduates of the Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC), Methodist University (MU) desires to provide a seamless transfer of graduates from the FTCC Associate in Applied Science degree program in Information Systems Security to the Bachelor of Science degree in Digital Forensics and Cyber Security (DFCS) at Methodist University. This partnership will be realized in the following activities:

### Methodist University agrees to:

- The Comprehensive Articulation Agreement between North Carolina Community Colleges and Methodist University.
- With regard to the major in DFCS, Methodist University agrees to accept a maximum of 18 semester hours of credit for Methodist University courses indicated in the following schedule. In order for courses to transfer to Methodist University, a C or better must be earned.




