

BLET GENERAL INFORMATION

The Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) Program is offered during the day and also in the evening.

The Day Academy:

- Is given twice a year (one starting in January and another in August)
- 700+ hours over approximately four (4) months
- Meets Monday-Friday 8:00am-5:00pm (PT 3X week 5:30pm-6:30pm)
 Some Saturdays and evenings when needed

The Evening Academy:

- Is given once a year (starting in September, graduating in May)
- 700+ hours over approximately eight (8) months
- Meets Monday-Friday 5:30pm-10:00pm and Saturday 8:00am-5:00pm (alternating weeks)
