- Summerscapes **registration closes at 4:45 pm two business days before the class start date**. For example, for classes beginning on Mon. 6/6, registration will close at 4:45 pm on Thurs. 6/2.
- Registrations will be processed in the order they are received, including online registrations. If a class is full, you may request to add your student’s name to the waiting list.
- We will need a parental consent/emergency contact form on file for each student. This form will either be completed at the window or submitted through DocuSign.

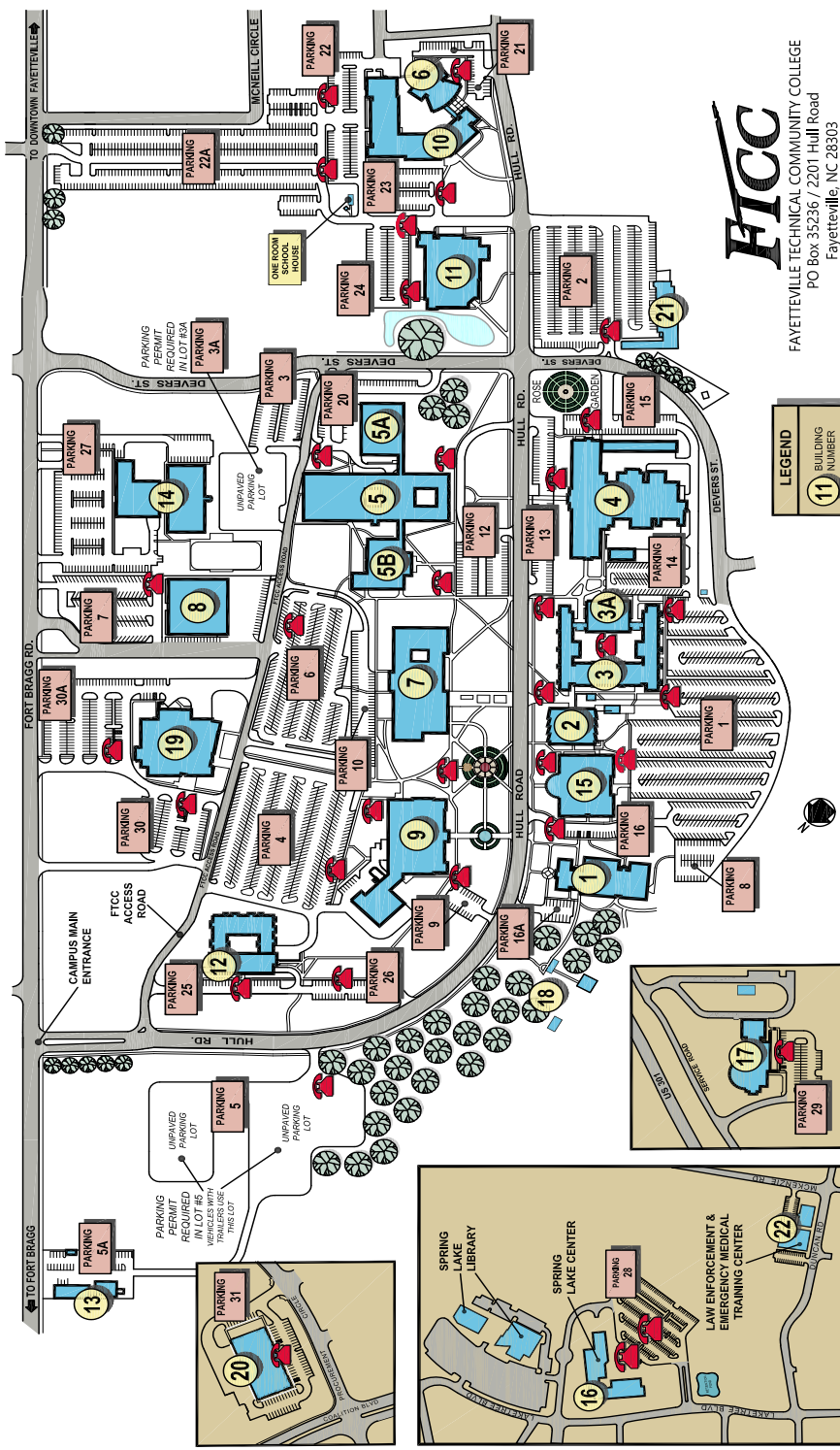

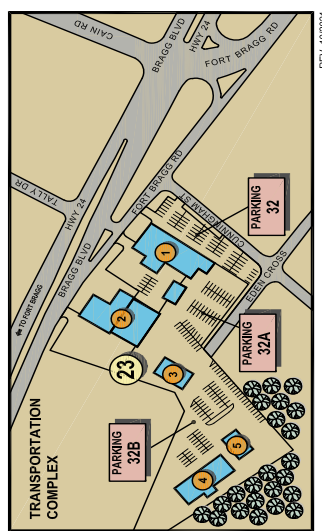
