Every October is Cybersecurity Month. The goal for this observance is to empower everyone to stay online. #BeCyberSmart

The theme for 2022 is "It's easy to stay safe online." To help, all month long four key security behaviors that everyone should adopt are being promoted. The four key behaviors are:

1. Enable Multi-Factor Authentication

Using MFA makes your accounts more secure than a password alone.

2. <u>Use Strong Passwords</u> and a <u>Password Manager</u>

A password manager can help you generate long, random passwords that are not easy for a attacker to guess and store them securely.

3. Update Your Software

Using automatic updates ensures your software has the latest security updates

4. Recognize and Report Phishing

If you were not expecting an email or text with a link in it, it could be a phishing attempt, so ensure you "Think before you click".
