Designed to provide information about the Work-Based Learning Program at Fayetteville Technical Community College

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FTCC Funeral Service Program, accredited by the American Board of Funeral Services (ABFSE), is one out of 59 Mortuary schools in the nation. In fact, FTCC is the only Community college in North Carolina that provides this program for their students. Graduates of this curriculum

may earn their Associates of Applied Sciences, or a NC Funeral Director Diploma, upon passing the state or national exam. This exam qualifies the students to become licensed Embalmers or Funeral Directors. The Work Based Learning Students of FTCC Funeral Service Program, develop

hands on training through their internships at Funeral Homes & Crematories throughout North Carolina. FTCC recently had an upgrade to the FSE Merchandising room in Cumberland Hall, sponsored by Batesville Casket Company.

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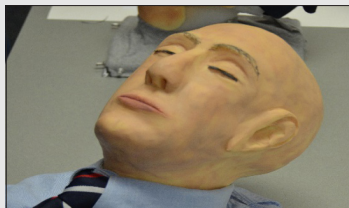
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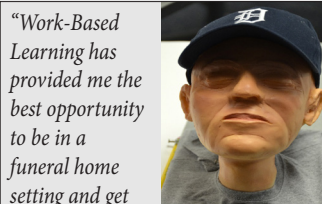
Student Presentations from the Restorative Arts Class



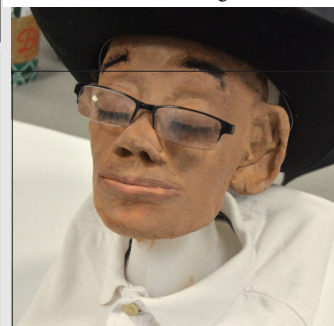

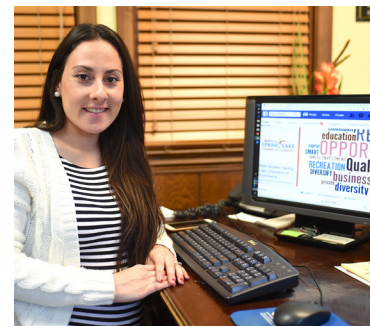

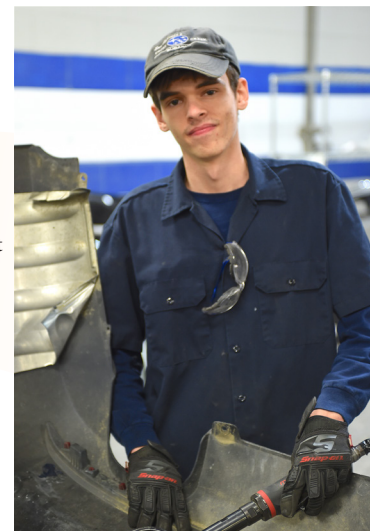
