

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

**Fayetteville State University Criminal Justice Department
Fayetteville Technical Community College Criminal Justice
Department**

I. Purpose

This Articulation Agreement establishes a seamless 3+1 pathway to baccalaureate degree completion in Criminal Justice at Fayetteville State University (FSU) for students who earn an Associate's Degree with Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC) and offers admission to Fayetteville State University who follow this pathway. Students will complete 90 credits hours at Fayetteville Technical Community College and earn an Associate's Degree in Criminal Justice and General Education. Students will have 30 credits hours to complete at Fayetteville State University and earn a baccalaureate degree in Criminal Justice.

II. Responsibilities - Fayetteville State University will:

- a. Identify a primary point of contact who will provide information about the program to FTCC students, staff, and faculty members and coordinate joint activities for students of both programs.
- b. Guarantee admission to FSU for FTCC 3+1 pathway students who complete an Associate's Degree and meet all FSU admissions requirements.
- c. Support other activities, as needed, to promote the success of the program.

III. Responsibilities - Fayetteville Technical Community College will:

- a. Identify a primary point of contact who will coordinate joint activities for students of both programs, inform FTCC students of these opportunities, and encourage students to participate in them.
- b. Develop, in conjunction with FSU faculty and staff, degree planning guides that permit seamless transfer of credits from FTCC to FSU.
- c. Support other activities, as needed, to promote the success of the program.
