Fayetteville Technical Community College and Methodist University Memorandum of Understanding

Introduction

This Articulation Agreement recognizes that the Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC) and Methodist University (MU) are active educational partners committed to providing greater educational opportunities and services for students transferring between institutions. This agreement supports the concept of a seamless transfer embracing the principle that transfer students should not be required to repeat competencies already achieved. FTCC and MU enter into this agreement in the spirit of cooperation and mutually recognize each other as quality institutions of higher learning.

Purpose

The purpose of the agreement is to enable FTCC students who transfer to MU to carry with them the credit they have already earned for as much relevant study as possible. The agreement provides a structure through which transfer articulation on all levels can be supported. Courses taken at FTCC by any delivery method are considered equally transferable.

Terms and Conditions

- This agreement becomes effective upon signing by both institutions and shall remain effective until one or both institutions deem it necessary to terminate the agreement. Either partner may terminate this agreement upon 90 days written notice to the other partner.
- 2. This agreement will be reviewed every two years by both institutions, and any amendments must be proposed in writing.
- 3. The Appendix of the agreement that contains the crosswalk(s) may be amended as necessary to ensure relevant information is accurate and current.
- 4. Both institutions will designate an individual who will be responsible for the maintenance of the agreement.
- 5. FTCC students who desire to transfer to MU must meet the same standards and criteria for admission as other MU students.
- 6. MU will encourage FTCC transfer students to complete the appropriate Associates Degree either before matriculation to MU or by reverse transfer of course credit following admission to and attendance at MU.
- 7. MU will develop a reverse transfer credit process that includes the methodology to notify students after they have completed at least 90 hours at the transfer institution.

- 8. MU agrees to share data related to FTCC transfer students annually. Shared data must include but is not limited to the following: number of transfer students, grades, degrees awarded, date enrolled, and date graduated, etc. Both institutions agree to follow all Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) regulations or requirements.
- 9. MU agrees to provide transfer students with information regarding the availability of transfer scholarships for eligible students as well as any other financial aid opportunities at MU.
- 10. FTCC agrees to inform students who are nearing graduation of transfer opportunities and what needs to be accomplished to meet transfer requirements.
- 11. MU and FTCC agree to cooperate in communicating information about this agreement. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student populations, will designate a marketing point of contact, and will annually review marketing materials to ensure accuracy.
- 12. FTCC agrees to invite MU to campus transfer fairs and other applicable campus-wide events, etc. The Transfer Counselors at FTCC will issue the invitation.
- 13. MU and FTCC agree to post information about their partnership and transfer/reverse transfer opportunities on their web sites and other related marketing materials and mediums.

Course and Program Transfer Crosswalks

Academic crosswalks outlining the course-by-course transfer of courses and/or specific programs is included in the appendix section of this agreement. A course-specific crosswalk is required for each transferrable program. Crosswalks approved after the initial signing of this agreement will be added and clearly identified as updates or amendments to this document and signed by the approving personnel of each institution.

Commitment to Transfer Students

MU will accept Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, and Associate of Applied Science degrees. All transfer credit must comply with the policies outlined in the Methodist University academic catalogue. MU will not place requirements on students transferring under this agreement that are not required of their native students. See general education equivalency chart in Appendix.

- 1. Students may apply and be admitted to FTCC and MU at the same time, granting a pathway for earning an Associate's degree and Bachelor's degree.
- 2. Students may apply to MU without incurring any application fees.
- 3. Students may take two courses, up to 8 credits, at MU while completing their associate's degree at FTCC at the current tuition rate at FTCC.
- 4. Students are guaranteed admission upon successful completion of the AA/AS/AAS degree with a 2.0 grade point average from FTCC.
- 5. A maximum of 64 semester hours of course work will be accepted from two-year post-secondary institutions.
- 6. Students must complete a minimum of 31 semester hours of their 124-credit bachelor's degree program at Methodist University (effective fall 2020).

- 7. Course grades of less than C will not be accepted.
- Requirements for admission to some major programs may require additional pre-specialty courses. Students entering such programs may need more than two academic years of course work to complete the baccalaureate degree, depending on requirements of the program.
- 9. Students will be provided an MU student identification card and will have access to events on the MU campus.
- 10. Students will have access to the Davis Memorial Library and be able to use the library computers for access to the library databases.
- 11. Students transferring from other accredited institutions who have maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.10 or better (on a four-point scale) on thirty-one (31) semester hours or more of college level work at the previous institution(s) will be offered a transfer Presidential Scholarship. Renewal of transfer Presidential Scholarships is determined at the end of a two-semester period and is contingent on the student making Satisfactory Academic Progress. Students seeking re-admission to Methodist University are ineligible to be considered for this scholarship. (See https://www.methodist.edu/financial-aid/academic-scholarships/ for more details.)
- 12. Students will have joint academic advising and financial aid counseling to maximize the savings offered when attending both FTCC and MU.

Review and Maintenance

This agreement will be in effect beginning (**December 2021**) and may be renewed by mutual consent of the two institutions. The agreement will be re-evaluated every two years. Either partner may terminate this agreement upon 90 days written notice to the other partner.
