Typical registration hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 am–4:45 pm. ***Note:*** *FTCC may follow a special summer schedule from mid-May through July. In this case, the window will be open from 7:30 am-4:45 pm Monday-Thursday and 7:30 am-1:15 pm on Fridays.*
- Many classes are also available for online registration. Please visit **learnftcc.com** and click the “**Summerscapes**” **tab**. Visa and Mastercard are accepted.
- Summerscapes **registration closes at 4:45 pm two business days before the class start date**. For example, for classes beginning on Mon. 6/5, registration will close at 4:45 pm on Thurs. 6/1.
- Registrations will be processed in the order they are received, including online registrations. If a class is full, you may request to add your student’s name to the waiting list.
- We will need a parental consent/emergency contact form on file for each student. This form will either be completed at the window or submitted through DocuSign.

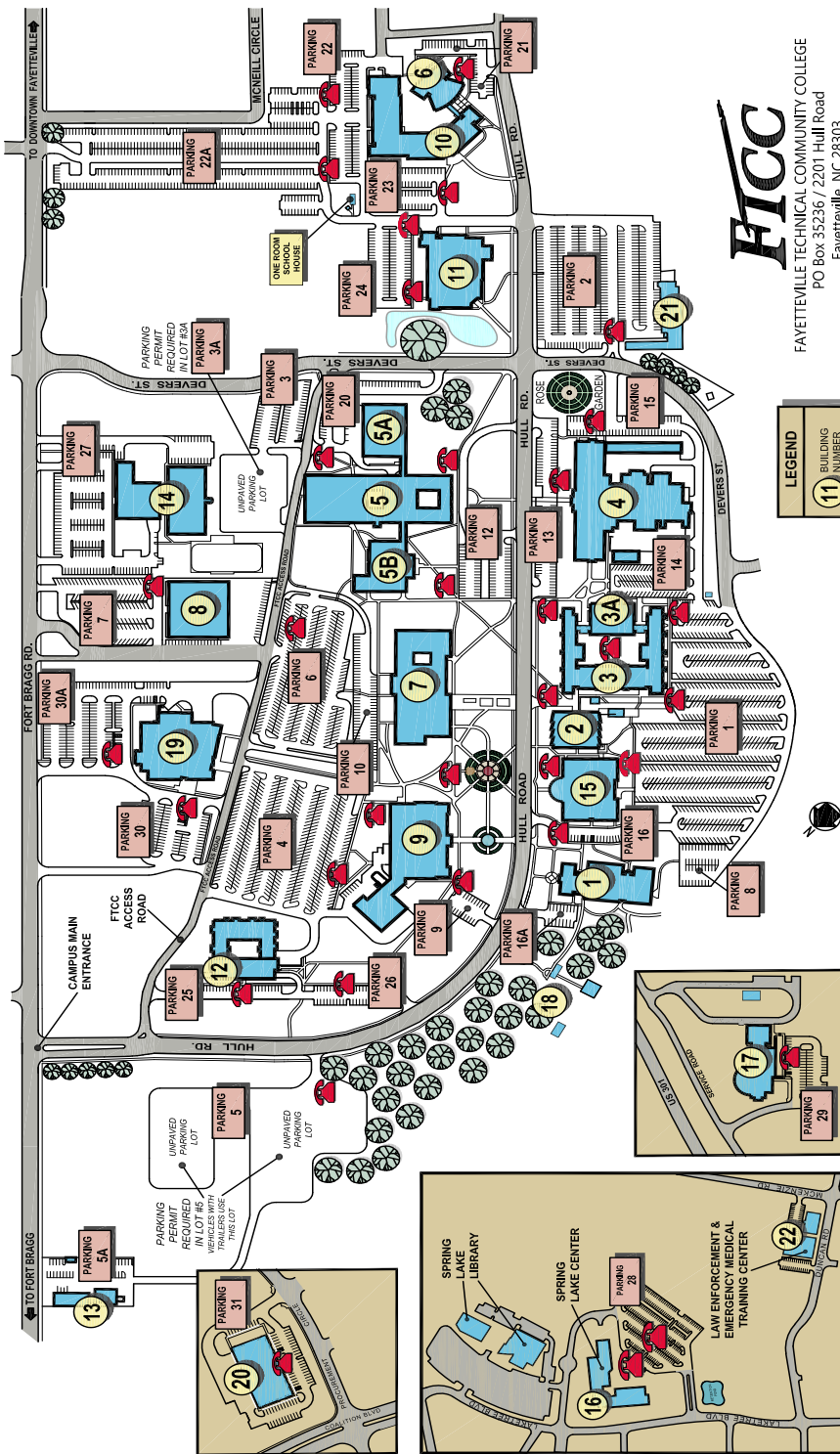

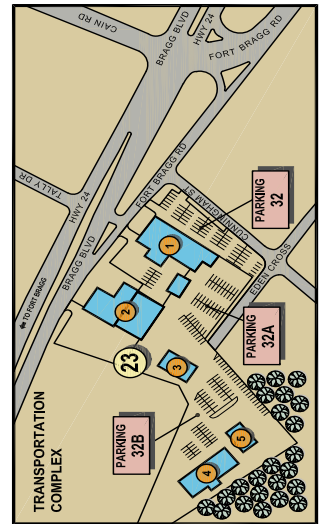
