- We will need a parental consent/emergency contact form on file for each student. This form will either be completed at the window or submitted through the online registration portal.

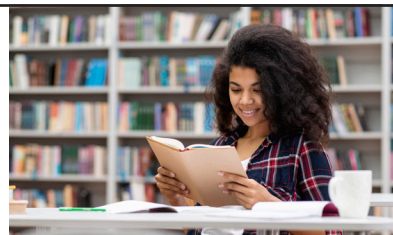

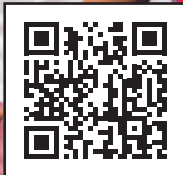

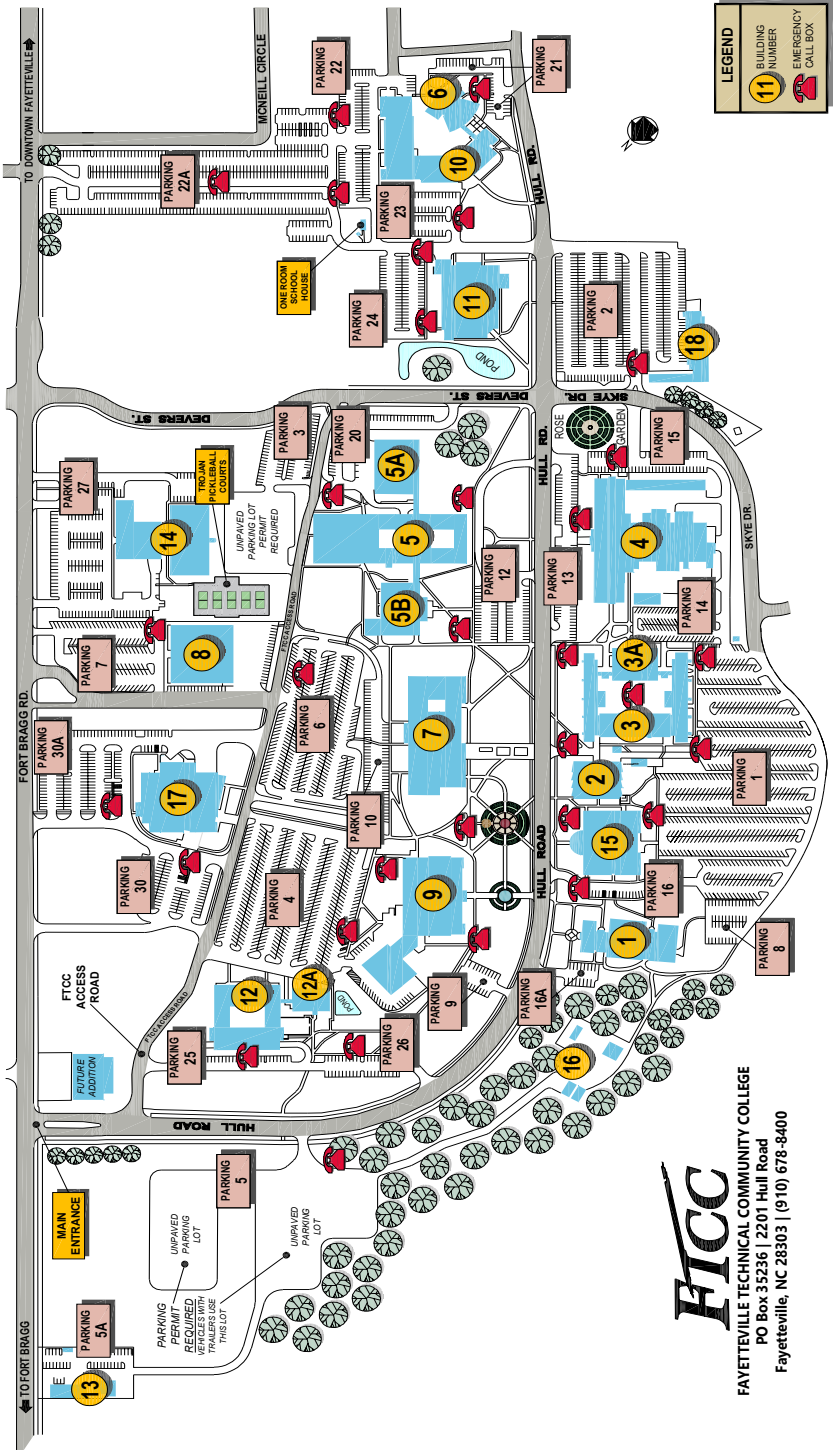
